

HISTORY

Welcome to the North Carolina Region of the Antique Automobile Club of America. This Region was formed in 1954 and, with nearly 1,000 members, has become the largest region in AACA. AACA is the largest car club in the world. The NC Region has sponsored many AACA national events over the years and has had two Grand National antique vehicle shows in the past decade. This includes the 2010 Grand National meet, which is part of the 75th anniversary year.

The North Carolina Region celebrated its 50th anniversary in 2004 with a four-day Region tour open to members across the country. This tour was regarded as one of the best-run tours of its kind. The Region also holds an annual business meeting that has become a model to which others aspire. This meeting offers a judging school, continuing judges education programs, and additional hobby-related programs over a two-day period. Because of our size and talent, the NC Region has had the honor of having multiple members hold offices in the AACA national organization.



SHOWS AND AWARDS

The Region also sponsors a spring and fall antique car show each year. The location for these shows rotates among the various chapters in the NC Region. Rotating the location allows an opportunity for different chapters to host the event as well as to provide a variety of interesting venues to visit either as a participant or a visitor.



Unique to the North Carolina Region is the Carolina Senior Red Bird award plaque, adopted by the Region in 1974, which is presented to those vehicles meeting national AACA judging standards of First Junior; the first step to AACA National recognition.

Membership in the AACA national organization is required in order to be a member of a region. You may also choose to join a local chapter. Membership in the NC Region includes a subscription to the bi-monthly newsletter, *North Carolina Region News*, a nationally recognized award-winning publication.
